Final nayment should be made by MARCH 20th. When making your denosit, nlease indicate whether you'll be raying the balance by check, credit card or if you wish to take advantage of a "Fly Now-Tay Later" rlan with SAS.

If you're going and don't have a massnort, annly NOW THROUGH your local U.S. Passnort Office. When annlying for your massnort, nlease obtain four massnort size mhotos mer merson (you'll need two for your massnort and two for the Polish visa.) If you have a massnort, check it to see if it's valid through May 1971.

We're mlanning to kick-off our reunion by meeting at one of the motels at Kennedy Airport. Your committee feels this offers more advantages than staying at a hotel "in town." More about this in the next issue of the ITEM.

Saturday May 08

Leave Kennedy International Airport, New York in late evening via SAS for jet flight to Warsaw via Comenhagen.

Sunday May 09

Arrive Warsaw early afternoon - transfer to hotel by private motorcoach. Evening at leisure. Many cities in Europe have been rebuilt since the second World War, but none in such a mainstaking manner as Warsaw. The old mart was reconstructed from photographs and maintings. Stroll through the Stare Miastro (Old City) and witness the fascinating result! The rebuilt 14th century Cathedral of St. John, the Old Town Market Flace, and the towers of 14th century Barbican, faithfully reproduced as they had existed for centuries.

Monday May 10

Morning city tour of Warsaw - lunch at hotel - afternoon departure by mctrcoach for Foznan. Dinner and overnight stay at hotel in Poznan.

Tuesday May 11

Morning excursion to Szubim - visit to WW II compaite and surroundings. Luncheon and afternoon return to Warsaw. Evening reception and dinner at hotel in Warsaw.

Wednesday May 12

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for a short flight to Vienna. Monday May 17

Enjoy the day ... shop, sightsee, or just relax.

Tuesday May 18

After breakfast, it's on to Comenhagen by air. This camital of Denmark will be the setting for our final days together before returning to the U.S.
