

It's always a great pleasure hearing from our Oflag 64 families. Thanks for keeping us in "your" loop and for sending information. We love reading about how and what you are doing. Please stay in touch!

<u>DEB MOHN ALTIMUS</u>, daughter of the late Kriegy John J. Mohn – wrote that her family is done with the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of their dad's book: Forced March, From the Bulge to Berchtesgaden. She reported that "he marched 1200 miles, with only a couple of very brief stays in prison camps." He ended up at Oflag 64 on January 11, just 10 days before the "Long, Cold March". Looking forward to the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition soon.

T. J. BUGG III, son of the late Kriegy Thomas J. Bugg, Jr. – responded to our request for POW ID photos, sharing that "I never saw one from Dad. Dad was captured October 6th, interrogated for over a month by the SS in Limburg Germany and then shipped to Oflag 64 arriving Friday, November 10th and then they all of course were sent out of the camp on January 21st. Perhaps those later arrivals did not get photos or perhaps Dad lost or got rid of his photo."





## **Topics of Interest**

#### Why is Flag Day celebrated on June 14?

Linda Sutherland, one of our Kriegy Kids, recently asked the above question. We didn't know exactly what the answer was and were curious ourselves, so we looked it up. This is what we found.

On **June 14**, 1777, the Continental Congress approved the design of a national flag. Since 1916, when President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation establishing a national Flag Day on June 14, Americans have commemorated the adoption of the Stars and Stripes in many ways – displaying the flag in the front of their homes, parades, and other patriotic observances.



Prior to 1916, many localities and a few states had been celebrating the day for years. Congressional legislation designating that date as the national Flag Day was signed into law by President Harry Truman in 1949; the legislation also called upon the president to issue a Flag Day proclamation every year.

Ardyn S. Thriffiley 1929 ~ 2024

Ardyn Sutherland Thriffiley, 94, passed away peacefully at her New Orleans home on July 1, 2024, after a day surrounded by her children.



She was preceded in death by her parents, Ruby Treadway Sutherland and Frederick Samuel Sutherland Jr., and her beloved husband, [the late Kriegy] Paul J. Thriffiley Jr.

Ardyn was born on September 21, 1929, in Alexandria, LA where she formed many lifelong friendships growing up. A member of "the Greatest Generation," she was a Jr. Red Cross volunteer during WWII, collected scrap for the war effort, and her family rented a room to a U.S. Army serviceman stationed at nearby Ft. Polk (and his wife).

She graduated from Providence Central High School in 1946, where she was voted "cutest." Ardyn attended Louisiana State University, where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority.

She became a stewardess for Eastern Airlines, flying out of New Orleans, before marrying Paul

in May 1953. Ardyn and Paul had five children, Paul J. III, Peter (Jeannette), Elizabeth T. Phelan, of Beaumont, TX, Erin T. Weston (Robert), and Ardyn M., all of whom survive her. Following the 1965 death of her husband Paul, Ardyn devoted herself to lovingly raising their five children, instilling in them an appreciation of the wonder and beauty of life. She later worked part- time at several retail shops, including The Bombay Co., Bonelli of Florence, and Mac Maison. She drove a Chevrolet station wagon full of her children on many summer trips to the Mississippi Gulf Coast, Destin, N. Carolina, Washington, D.C, Colorado, California, Mexico, and Texas.

Ardyn was a lifelong devoted Catholic and a member of Holy Name of Jesus Parish in New Orleans, where her children attended grammar school. She participated in her children's extracurricular activities, including Brownies and Boy Scouts. She served as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion for many years, ministering to the homebound, and devoted a regular hour in the church's adoration chapel. She faithfully attended weekday mass at Loyola University's Ignatius Chapel.

Ardyn enjoyed riding her bicycle daily, through Tulane University, Audubon Park, uptown in general, and often to Mass, until her 86th year. She enjoyed playing her large upright piano, which she had since childhood. Ardyn also sewed many dresses and formal gowns for her three daughters, as well as for herself.

In addition to her five children, "Gram" is survived by nine grandchildren and fourteen greatgrandchildren, Peter S. Thriffiley Jr. (Dylan - Thompson, Margot, Cooper, Amelia, Jackson), Michael Thriffiley (Rachael - Colin, Connor, William, Mary), Claire Thriffiley (Alan), Will Weston (Sarah - Walker, Henry), Elizabeth Weston George (Will - Weston), Maia Weston (Neal), Mickey Phelan IV (Sarah - Mollie), John Phelan (Caitlin - Lucy), and Kathryn Phelan.

Thriffiley, Jr. Elizabeth attended Holy Name of Jesus Grammar School in New Orleans and graduated from Mercy Academy High School directly across the street, forming lifelong friendships at both schools.

She attended Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, and was a legacy member of Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority, where she also formed lasting friendships. Elizabeth's sisters and her daughter were also legacy Kappas, something special that they shared.

Elizabeth moved to Washington, D. C., after graduating from LSU. There she worked on Capitol Hill for two different Republican Congressmen, and later for the National Security Council. She was later employed by the RNC, working local elections in the Midwest. She then managed a furniture and accessories store, The Bombay Company, which opened in 1981 in the new "The Shops at Georgetown Park" mixed use shopping mall and condominiums. After returning to New Orleans in 1983, Elizabeth worked a number of years as an assistant to the comptroller of the Sheraton Hotel on Canal Street.

She lovingly raised her children in the Catholic faith, educating them at St. Anne Catholic School and Monsignor Kelly Catholic High School. Elizabeth dedicated her life to her children. She was very involved at St. Anne during her children's time there, occasionally volunteering as a substitute teacher. She was a member of St. Anne's annual fair committee.

She was a Cub Scout leader for both of her sons and started the first "Pink Tops" Tee-ball league at West End Little League for her daughter and her friends. She was also involved in the many other athletic pursuits by her children over the years, such as her sons' little league baseball activities.

Elizabeth worked for the Neches River Festival for six years, and later worked part-time at Talbots for years. She enjoyed her book club for many years and also played Mahjong in later life. She enjoyed cooking and preparing daily and holiday meals for her family. She also enjoyed walking, including morning walks with Nola and the family labs preceding her. Elizabeth loved all of her 22nd Street neighbors, and it was reciprocal.

In recent years, Elizabeth joyfully welcomed into her life, two daughters-in-law and two granddaughters, one from each. Survivors include her beloved children, Mickey Phelan IV and his wife, Sara; John Paul Phelan and his wife, Caitlin; and Kathryn Phelan; grandchildren, Molly McDade Phelan and Lucy Ann Phelan; siblings, Paul J. Thriffiley III; Peter S. Thriffiley Sr. and his wife, Jeannette; Erin T. Weston and her husband, Robert; and Ardyn M. Thriffiley; numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins; and her aging Beagle companion, Nola.

She is preceded in death by her dear parents. Elizabeth is and will be dearly missed by her family and friends. She left us too soon. May God grant her the eternal rest and everlasting life she earned while on this earth.
