

# MAIL CALL



It's always a great pleasure hearing from our Oflag 64 families. Thanks for keeping us in "your" loop and for sending information. We love reading about how and what you are doing. Please stay in touch!

<u>Cindy Sharpe Burgess, daughter of the late Kriegy Wilbur B. Sharpe</u> – sent photos of her dad and George Juskalian, fellow POW, participating in WWII Day 2009 at Rocky Run Middle School. They, along with other community presenters shared their WWII experiences with the students. Additionally, she sent a photo of her dad with Frank Maxwell and also one of Frank belting out a song. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM).

<u>Joan Callahan, daughter of the late Kriegy Francis Charles Callahan</u> – recently found our website and volunteered to send any information we might need regarding her dad and his WWII experiences and time spent at Oflag 64. She has read through his memoir in preparation for writing his biography and has sent an excerpt from the memoir. Her dad brought back several interesting items from Oflag 64 along with some he found after his escape. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM.) We noticed we didn't have his name on our TAPS list, but it has now been added.

<u>Susanna Bolten Connaughton, daughter of the late Kriegy Seymour R. Bolten</u> – sent a link to photos of the Tin Store development and design process. Susanna is the Vice President of the Board of the Polish-American Foundation for the Commemoration of POW Camps in Szubin. <u>Sue Dockstader</u>, granddaughter of the late Moosburg Kriegy Jack Dockstader – wrote asking for as much information as we might have on her grandfather. She remembered hearing when she was young that the food in the camp where he was held captive consisted of thin soup with beetles in it and that all were starving, including the captors. Our information on other camps is extremely limited but because she knew that her grandfather was at Hammelburg, we referred her to Peter Domes, the Hammelburg expert who lives in Germany near Hammelburg.

<u>Peter Domes, researcher and expert on the Hammelburg Raid</u> – responded to Sue Dockstader's request for as much information as she could get on her grandfather. Peter shared that her grandfather was a Private First Class in the 10<sup>th</sup> Armored Infantry Battalion. He took part in the Hammelburg Raid and was taken Prisoner of War by the Germans on 27 March 1945. Peter supposed he was moved after the incident to Moosburg, Oflag VIIB and was finally liberated by the 14th Armored Division. He asked Sue to send scans or photos of her grandfather and any other information she has about his military time.

<u>Peter P. Gaich, son of the late Kriegy Peter N. Gaich</u> – contacted us about a book he found while wandering around on the web. In it is an excerpt naming his dad and details of the walk to Russia with his fellow officers, Lts. Cory and Murphy. The book is entitled <u>Bastards of the Eastern Front</u> and was written by a Ukranian author. You can find the excerpt at: <a href="https://bit.ly/3tKOnVv">https://bit.ly/3tKOnVv</a>

<u>Bill Geroux</u>, a researcher and author – wrote asking if we had any photos of Col. William Schaefer in our records. Unfortunately, the only one we have is one taken by the International Red Cross, a photo of 5 men, 4 Kriegy senior officers and 1 civilian. Col. Schaefer is in the middle. If you have a photo of Col. Schaefer and are willing to share, please contact us. Bill's book is about the "fifteen American POWs – including the Col. and fellow ex-Kriegy Lt. James Schmitz – who were condemed to die by the Germans in an attempt to trade them for fifteen German POWs who were convicted of murder and sentened to die for killing other German POWs in camps in the U.S." It will hopefully be published in 2025.

Alison Rogers Heasley, great niece of Frank A. Aten – wrote that she would like to be added to our email list and that through her mom, Ann Rogers, already feels like part of the family. We have added her to our list as requested.

<u>Victoria Herring</u>, daughter of the late <u>Kriegy Clyde E. Herring</u> – in response to our email request about the "Winter Melodies" playbill wrote that she has a bunch which are pasted into a scrapbook but might not be that difficult to extract. We're looking forward to learning if she's successful.

<u>Warren Jones, son of the late Kriegy Charles L. Jones</u> – sent a copy of a photo we have online and in it identified his dad. The photo is of Iowa Kriegies but only had one Kriegy previously identified. We now have been able to identify three. He also sent a variety of photos from a 2002 publication called "Enemies Within" that include his dad during war years. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM.) Scans of other artifacts were later scanned and sent.

Robert Lee, son of the late Kriegy Royal I. Lee – has been working with one of our bio writers to get as much information included as possible in his dad's bio. Nearly ready to put online. Waiting for some photos.

<u>David Little, grandson of the late Kriegy Thomas H. Wingate</u> – has been doing vast amounts of research regarding our Oflag 64 Kriegies, their captures including routes they may have taken, their "camp" experiences, their long march routes, escapes or repatriations. For his research he has also done a fair amount of traveling in Europe retracing routes taken at different times. We'll be hearing soon about the chain of events that led to the men escaping Russian control. <u>Lucy Lussenden</u>, <u>widow of the late Kriegy Donald A. Lussenden</u> – wrote with additional information to include in Don's bio. <u>Marlene McAllister, daughter of the late Kriegy Robert T. Thompson</u> – since leaving her position with the Foundation Council has become involved in countless ways to benefit not only the Foundation Council and Board, Friends of Oflag 64, Inc., but also Oflag 64 Remembered. For "Remembered", she will be proofreading biographies, which will be an invaluable service. Her expertise in other areas will be greatly appreciated.

<u>Jessica Ziparo McHugh, granddaughter of the late Kriegy John Stoehr</u> – sent a photo of a page from her grandfather's scrapbook which included not only names but addresses, which we won't publish, but the names are: Lt. Ward, Lt. Ostrander, Lt. Gwosden, Lt. Richard, Lt. Morton, Lt. Hansen, Lt. Stoehr, and Lt. Graf who appear to be part of Mess Group 210. The names are written in all caps and look either professionally printed on the page or hand-lettered in calligraphy style. There is a "gepruft" stamp at the top. A very unique document.

<u>Jim Maxwell, son of the late Kriegy Frank Maxwell</u> – responded to our email request for an original copy of the "Winter Melodies" playbill. Frank was in several Little Theater productions so Jim though he might find one amongst his dad's belongings. Unfortunately there wasn't one but there are other playbills and photos that Jim will scan and share if they're not online already.

<u>Marianne Liggett Merriam – daughter of the late Kriegy F. Eugene Liggett</u> – wrote that she is now serving as Council Chairman/President of the Polish-American Foundation for the Commemoration of POW Camps in Szubin. Serving with her are Tom Cobb, Pat Waters, Robert Thompson and Jan Karcz. This reflects the change in Chairman/President only. All others have previously served or have recently been elected to serve.

<u>Bill Moore, nephew of the late Kriegy Louis E. Moore</u> – has been spent a considerable amount of time looking for his cousins, sons of Louis Moore, but without success. We recently found a little bit of information to assist him and are waiting to hear if contact has been made. We're hoping that with contact some of the puzzle pieces will be put together.

Ann Chapel Rogers, niece of the late Kriegy Frank N. Aten – wrote with information she found on the late Kriegy Paul Marable, who was the subject of her bio writing at the time. She further wrote that the focus is on Paul Marable and several others who personally experienced the war up close and personal. Check this link: <a href="https://billmoyers.com/content/d-day-update/">https://billmoyers.com/content/d-day-update/</a> While researching, she found that Paul wrote a book entitled "Two Hundred Fifty-Five Days", which is unfortunately out of print and no longer available. However, one was found on eBay, and was purchased and donated to the Tin Store Museum library.

<u>Al Sokerka, son of the late Kriegy Andrew R. Sokerka</u> – found some interesting spoons amongst his father's belongings. His mom thought they were used by his dad while at Oflag 64. We can't say for certain, but in looking online we found that they're probably Russian. Two Kriegies, who we're aware of, bought identical spoons in Odessa after escaping the long, cold march. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM.)

<u>Dave Stewart, son of the late Kriegy Donald B. Stewart</u> – wrote to inform us that the book he has written about the Katyn Massacre has been published in Poland. It is written in English and Polish and is the first in a series. For his work, he received the Pro Pratia medal presented by a Polish Cabinet member. Professor Tadeusz Wolsa called it one of the five milestone books written about the Katyn Massacre since the year 2000. Another professor called it the best American investigation into the Katyn Massacre since the Madden Committee. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM.) Separately, Dave has been an avid MIS-X researcher and is working with some recently found code letters that were sent back and forth from selected code writers and users to and from the American side during the war. Dave also continues to learn more about our Kriegies. He has found a few names on our database that have needed a correction or two. Changes have been made and all should be up-to-date as far as we know.

John H. Van Vliet III, son of the late Kriegy John H. Van Vliet, Jr. – sent a copy of a map that his father and grandfather marked up showing what happened during the opening stages of Kasserine Pass. His father, after escaping and finishing reports about Katyn, spent some convalescent time at Ft. Leavenworth with his own father who was serving there. (See the Kriegy News and Information section of this ITEM.)

Marvin Williams, researcher and friend of Oflag 64 – wrote with information and a photo he found online of Col. Drake and his wife Quincy. He's also been instrumental in connecting some of our Kriegy Kids and other researchers together as they search for information about various Kriegies. Marvin's dad was not a Kriegy from Oflag 64 but served under Col. Drake for a time and was acquainted with many of our men. He has recently found information on these Kriegies: James Cooney, Thomas Drake, Ed Graf, Herbert Hayes, George Juskalian, Richard B. Parker, Don Waful and sent their information and a map.

<u>Jeff Wilson, grandson of the late Kriegy Robert L. Aschim</u> – was browsing through our website photos and found one which included his grandfather, but who was unidentified. We updated our lowa Kriegy photo and identified his grandfather. Jeff also asked to be added to our email list.





Welcome to the online home of the former POWs of Oflag 64. The prisoner of war camp designated Oflag (Offizierslager) 64 was established by the Germans during World War II in Szubin, Poland (written 'Schubin' by the Germans) to detain captured American officers. The first American officers arrived in the camp on June 6, 1943. The initial occupants numbered around 150. By the time the camp was evacuated in January 1945, their ranks had grown to approximately 1,400.

The "Kriegies" (short for Kriegsgefangenen: prisoners of war) made the best of their situation organizing sports events, musical and theatrical performances and escape plans. While held captive, these men published their own monthly newspaper called the "ITEM", several issues of which are available for download elsewhere on this website.

This website is a means of communicating the ongoing news and events of the men of Oflag 64 and their families, as well as a means to gather information about these men and

Here are just a few highlights of this site's content:

- "Archives" contains the personal stories of many who were held at Oflag 64, as well as issues of the camp newspaper, copies of Red Cross POW Bulletins and other period




